Word	Definition
Seasons	Four divisions of the year set by the weather patterns within different months
Weather	Differences in the atmosphere – sunny, snowy, windy, rainy
UK	The United Kingdom is made up of 4 countries: England, Northern Ireland, Scotland & Wales
Temperature	The degree of heat in the air

Months of each season;

Spring – March, April & May
Summer – June, July & August
Autumn – September, October & November
Winter – December, January & February

The Weather:



Spring – New plants start to grow and baby animals are born. It starts to become warm.



Summer – It starts to get hot and the sun is seen more.



Autumn – Leaves turn brown and fall off trees. It starts getting cooler.



Winter – The weather is cold and it sometimes snows.

The Four Seasons

Autumn	September October November

Autumn



- The weather gets colder
- Leaves fall from the trees
- Day times are shorter
- Night times are longer

Winter



- The weather is much colder
- Sometimes there is frost and ice on the ground
- It sometimes snows
- Many trees have bare branches
- Day times are the shortest
- Night times are the longest

Spring



- The weather gets warmer
- Leaves begin to grow on trees
- Some trees have blossom
- Plants begin to grow
- Some baby animals like lambs are born
- Day times are longer

Summer




- The weather gets hotter
- Trees are full of leaves
- There are lots of flowers
- There are lots of bees, butterflies and other insects


